Your Lordship,

I greet you in the Name of Jesus Our Loving Saviour!

It is true to say that we are in difficult times - no different than when Christ walked the Earth.

It is with great sadness in my heart I note that you have not as yet responded to my letter dated the 29th September, 1999.

1. By your Decree 27th September, 1999, you preempted the findings of the Commission.
2. You published those findings in a Press Conference the following morning 28th September, 1999.
3. You ordered the removal of the Order of Saint Charbel, which is the essence of the investigation.
4. Attention is drawn to the right any accused faithful to have their case referred directly to the Holy See.
5. Accordingly, because of your prejudicial preemption of the findings of the Investigation Commission which you have set up, and the Publication on the 28th September, 1999, of those pre-empted findings under the issue of a Decree dated 27th September, 1999.
6. Therefore, I HEREBY OFFICIALLY APPEAL to His Holiness, John Paul II, and the Holy See, to intervene in this matter.
7. And you are requested to forthwith forward this Letter of Appeal under Canons 1628; 1638; 1417.

Canon 1628: Without prejudice to the provisions of Canon 1629, a party who considers him or herself to be injured by a judgement has a right to appeal from the judgement to a higher judge; in cases in which their presence is required, the promoter of justice and the defender of the bond have likewise the right to appeal.

Canon 1638: An Appeal suspends the execution of the judgement.

Canon 1417: Affirms every one of the faithful have the right to introduce their case or refer their case directly to the Holy See. Further, the Holy See has the right to reserve a given case to itself alone.


8. Your public defamation of myself and the members of the Order of Saint Charbel requires an immediate personal, official, and very public withdrawal, and apology.
